As a PhD student in the Department of Curriculum and Pedagogy at the University of British Columbia, his research interests include (popular) music education, social justice, and the neoliberalization of public education.

Andrée Gacoin is Director of the Division of Information, Research and International Solidarity at the British Columbia Teachers' Federation. Her research focuses on developing a unique, in-depth and contextualized exploration of education in BC from the perspective of teachers. Andrée is particularly interested in using research as advocacy to uphold and strengthen an inclusive public education system.

Shannon Moore



Shannon DM Moore was a public-school educator and advocate in Vancouver for nearly two decades. She is one of the founding members of People for Public Education, Manitoba, and the co-host of Public Good, a podcast about public education in Canada. Her recent research and writing focus on the impact of neoliberal reforms and policies in/on public education and the ways that "parental rights" are being used to advance privatization, erode trust in public education, and undermine teacher professionalism.
